BIOGRAPHY

Bryan Martel is an engineer and executive with over 30 years of experience. His career started at Bechtel where he worked on nuclear waste storage. He then served at Dow Chemical as a senior research engineer, working on aerospace projects and then on scaling up large-scale polymer recycling solutions. Bryan then founded Mobius Technologies to commercialize recycling of urethane foams. Mobius developed novel technologies, scaled them up, and built chemical process plants around the world to recycle plastics. To do this Bryan developed partnerships with private equity teams and Dow Chemical. After selling Mobius, Bryan worked with large pension funds like CalPERS, CalSTRS, and New York State Common to mobilize very large amounts of capital to support the private equity markets to help solve climate change problems. Bryan also co-founded Berkeley Engineering and Research while at UC Berkeley with Glen Stevick and Philip Alei, and still proudly wears his engineering hat to help solve challenging problems worth solving. Bryan earned his degrees from UC Berkeley.
